This website is run by Elsham Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

Technical information about this website’s accessibility

PDFS and other documents

Many of our older PDFs may not meet accessibility standard – for example, they may not be structured so they’re accessible to a screen reader.

The accessibility regulations do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23rd September 2018 if they are not essential to providing our services. For example. We do not plan to fix agenda and minutes published before that date.

Any new PDFs we public will meet accessibility standards.

How we tested this website

This website was last tested on the 31-Mar-2026. The test was carried out by manual and automated means by Kyanite Consulting Limited.
